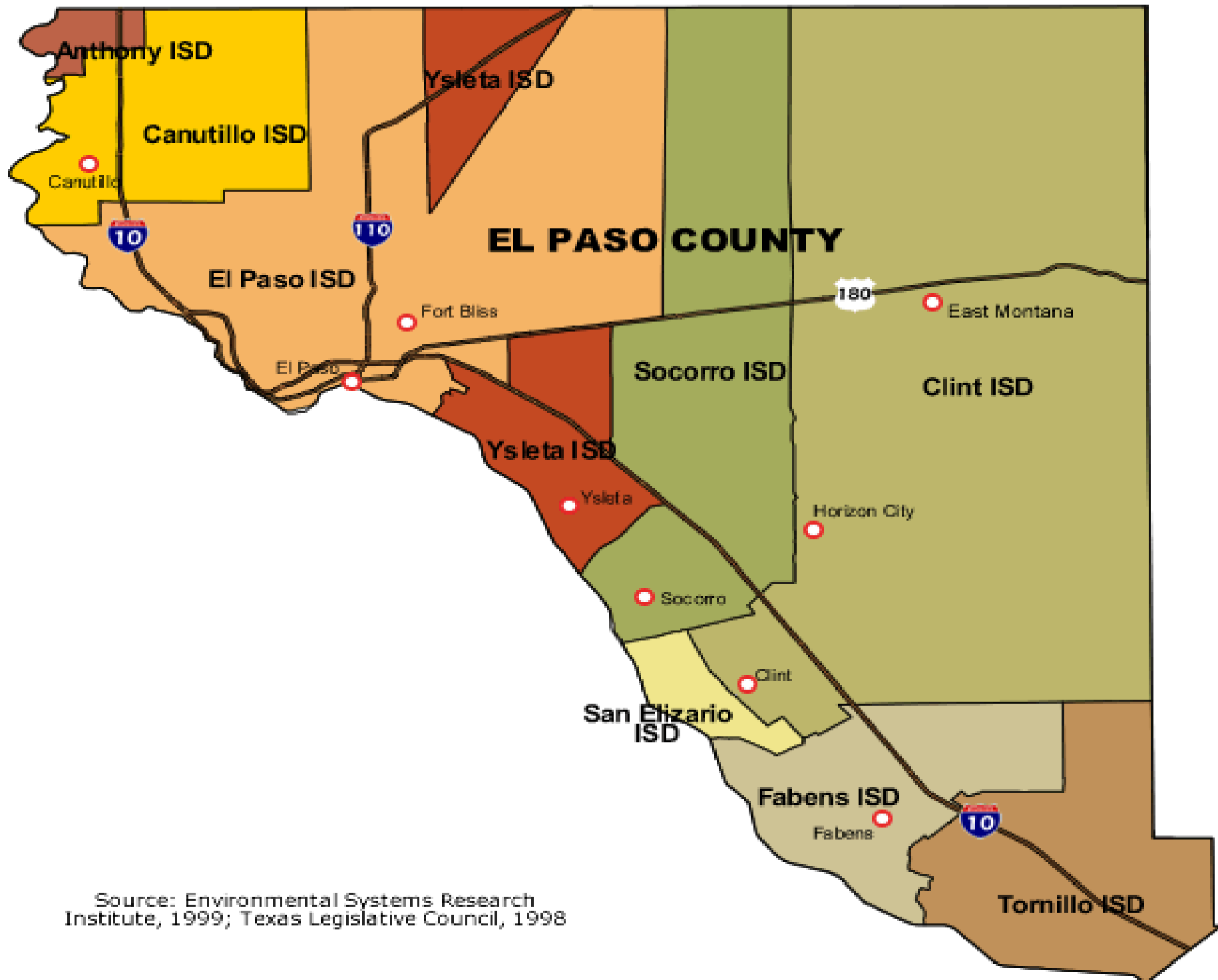

- I. Introduction - El Paso County has nine public independent school districts serving students Pr-K through 12. These districts range in size from 850 students in the Anthony Independent School District to 63000 in the El Paso Independent School District. Students qualify to attend schools in these districts based on their residence. The larger school districts have feeder patterns consisting of elementary schools that feed into middle schools that feed into a high school. A family's place of residence will identify the feeder pattern that students will attend.

There are several Private/Parochial Schools in the El Paso area. Additionally, there are a number of Public Charter Schools. Information on these schools can be found on pages 44 & 45 of the Fort Bliss Parent Student Handbook. An online copy of the handbook can be accessed through the School Liaisons Services website (www.blissmwr.com).

- II. Below are school performance data from 2009/10 Texas Education Agency School Report Cards. 2010/11 data will not be available until the Fall of 2011.
- The data are based on the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS). This exam is administered annually to children in grade levels 3-11. Tests on the TAKS are reading, mathematics, science, and social studies at grades 9-11. Grades 3-8 also include a writing assessment.
 - The 2010/11 school year will be the last during which the TAKS is used. It is being replaced by the State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness (STAAR).
 - State Rating – TAKS data is used to determine each schools and districts accountability rating. The state accountability system rates schools as:
 - Unacceptable (red)**- if less than 55% of the students passed the Science, less that 60% passed the Math, and less than 70% passed the English Language Arts (ELA) and Social Studies.
 - Acceptable (amber)** - if at least 55% passed Science, 60% passed Math, and 70% passed ELA and Social Studies.
 - Recognized (green)** - if at least 80% passed Science, Math, ELA, and Social Studies.
 - Exemplary (dark green)** - if at least 90% passed Science, Math, ELA, and Social Studies.

Please note that the above criteria were for 2009/10. The criteria for 2010/11 were higher at the Acceptable level.

Federal rating – Based on No Child Left Behind (NCLB) – Math and ELA TAKS data used for grade levels 3-8 and 10 grade. This system looks at sub-population performance on the assessment – White, African-American, Hispanic, Economically Disadvantaged, Special Education, and English Language Learners. Schools and districts either meet Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) or missed AYP.

Meets AYP (Yes) if at least 73% of the students and the sub-populations passed the ELA and 67% passed the Math assessments.

Missed AYP (NO) if less than 73% pass the ELA and less than 67% pass the Math.

Please note that the above criteria were for 2009/10. The criteria for 2010/11 were higher. Also, other criteria (sub-population performances and participation rates for example) were taken into consideration when determining ratings

- Also included in the data below are high school four and five year graduation rates. The four year graduation rates are for the Class of 2009. The five year graduation rates are for the class of 2008. Texas requires 26 credits for graduation under the Recommended High School Plan in addition to mastery of all four sections of the EXIT Level TAKS (11th grade TAKS).
- Also listed for each campus is their enrollment for 2009/10 and the number of military connected students. The enrollment number was provided by TEA and the number of military connected students was provided by the different school district based on self reporting by families.

IV. Advanced Academics:

- All of the public schools in the El Paso area offer Gifted and Talented (GT) programs at the elementary and middle school levels. These programs vary in structure from campus to campus. Please contact the administration at the respective campus for a description of their programs.
- GT students at the high school level are addressed through the Advanced Placement (AP) program. Most AP courses are offered at the Junior and Senior levels. Freshmen and Sophomores are offered Pre-AP courses in most of the core content areas.
- Area high schools also offer a variety of Dual Credit courses to qualified students (based on testing). Please contact each high school for a listing of their Dual Credit courses.
- Coronado HS (EPISD) and El Dorado HS (SISD) offer an International Baccalaureate program.
- There are five Early College High Schools in the El Paso area. These schools are designed to allow it students the opportunity to earn a high school diploma and an Associate’s Degree concurrently. These schools are designed to enroll students as freshmen:

SISD- Mission Early College High School (ECHS)

Ysleta- Valle Verde ECHS

EPISD-Trans Mountain ECHS

Canutillo -Westside ECHS

- V. Athletics – Public Schools in the El Paso area offer a variety of athletic programs. These programs start at the middle school level and are run under the guidelines of the University Interscholastic League (UIL). UIL is very specific on eligibility for athletic participation at the high school level. Residency in the school’s attendance zone is critical. Students who enter high school at the sophomore year or higher, choose to participate in athletics, and have participated in high school sports in the past will need to get a Previous Athletic Participation Form (PAPF) signed by their previous coach and administrator. Blank PAPFs can be obtained from any Texas Public High School or the UIL website (www.uil texas.org). All of the rules and regulations governing high school athletics in the State of Texas can be accessed through the above website.

All athletes (to include cheerleaders) must have a current physical on file with the school’s athletic trainer. Official UIL Physical Forms can be downloaded from the website listed above.

VI. Discipline Data – Discipline Data as provided by the Texas Education Agency through their Annual Discipline Summary based on on Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) Data for 2009/10. The information provided in the following chart reflects only a portion of what is reported to PEIMS. The data reflects only middle school and high school discipline activity:

- The first column shows the number of students who were enrolled at the campus at any time during the 2009/10 school year and could have received a discipline referral.
- The second column shows the number of students who received a discipline referral for any infraction of the code of conduct – serious or minor.
- The third column shows the percentage represented by students in column two. This is only presented at the state and district levels. Please note that eight of the nine area districts have a smaller percentage of students involved in discipline infractions than the state average.
- Column four reflect the number of students who were removed to the Juvenile Justice Alternative Education Program (JJAEP) as per the Texas education Code. JJAEP is reserved for serious infractions of the Code of Conduct that require that students be removed from the campus.
- Column five reflects the number of students who had serious infractions that required expulsion.
- Column six reflects the number of students who were removed from the regular classroom setting and placed in the District Alternative Education Program (DAEP). Some DAEPs are located away from the regular school campus. Some school house a DAEP on campus.
- Columns 7-19 reflect a variety of serious offenses reported to PEIMS.
